Medieval Music and Story Workshop For Gr. 4-7 students (approx.75')

Summary

This workshop will teach children about music and storytelling, and the troubadour movement in the middle ages, especially as it relates to the harp. Students will learn the history of medieval woodwinds, harps, and troubadours, and listen to a musical troubadour story, which they will act out in tableau. Evaluation will take the form of an informal quiz.

Program Content:

Historical Information: about 20 minutes

A brief history of the harp and woodwinds in ancient times

A demonstration of early musical styles

A brief history of the bardic and troubadour tradition and the influence of the crusades

Participation through movement: 5 minutes

"Let's Make a Medieval Statue"

Medieval Quiz: 5 minutes

Students will answer questions orally based on the information they have been given.

Listening to the story: 25 minutes

Students will listen to "The Faithful Wife" a story from the 13th Century, about a wife who secretly saves her husband from slavery through tenacity, cunning & music. It is interspersed with Medieval and Celtic music.

Creating and performing Tableaux. 20 minutes

Students will be divided into groups of four to six children and will be given a sentence that relates to one scene from the story, which they will rehearse and perform for the group.

OPTIONAL:

1. Q. and A. (5-10 minutes)

The Players are happy to answer questions about historical, musical subjects or their experience as musicians.

- 2. Medieval Dance lesson in lieu of Tableaux
- 3. Group Recorder lesson in lieu of Tableaux

Workshop Fee: \$250 or \$450 for both a morning and afternoon session.

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Angelica Ottewill is a trained singer, harpist and storyteller who performs music and stories for all ages.
